



# WASZP Games 2025

## Weymouth, UK, 19th - 25th July 2025



Arriving in Weymouth to see nearly 250 boats ready for an epic week of racing was surreal. After three days of training, qualifying kicked off with perfect 15–20 knot conditions.

My fleet was sent well out into Weymouth Bay, much further than expected, in big waves. A few boat-handling errors cost me some spots, but I still posted a 10th, 3rd, 7th,

and 4th. After a 45-minute sail in, I'd covered nearly 50NM (92 km), a big first day!

Day 2 brought tactical racing inside the harbour, with a boundary splitting the courses. In race one, I spotted a golden chance for a port-tack start from the pin and nailed it, crossing all 70 boats, easily a regatta highlight. My results were 3rd, 11th, 7th, and 6th, wrapping up qualifying in 15th overall and into the Gold Fleet.

Day 3's light and shifty breeze meant fleet racing out in the bay. The inconsistent breeze made every second count as the final series kicked off. Getting off the start line was key and tough with so many boats, even small mistakes caused big gains or losses in such a competitive fleet.

On Day 4, the wind didn't cooperate, with Gold Fleet completing just one race. The final day returned to the harbour in patchy breeze, making staying on the foils a real challenge. Four intense races wrapped up the WASZP Games.

After a tough last day, I placed 27th overall but was proud to hold onto top Aussie. It was an epic week, awesome to race among so many boats in such close competition.
